Introduction

GHA recognises pets can have a very positive effect on people's lives and provide companionship and enjoyment for a great many people. We wish to support residents to be responsible pet owners, therefore do not impose unnecessary restrictions on pet ownership. Equally, we know pets are expensive to look after and if not cared for correctly cause damage to properties and can be a nuisance and danger to other residents.

GHA's policy aims to strike a balance so that responsible residents can enjoy the benefits of pet ownership but this is not an automatic right. Permission will be withdrawn should owners not behave responsibly.

This policy covers the following issues

- What pets can be kept and in what circumstances
- Actions GHA take when pets are kept inappropriately or cause a nuisance to neighbours.

1. Applicants applying for Social Housing

a. People applying for social housing are asked to indicate on their application form if they intend to keep a pet. This will not prejudice their application unless they plan to keep a pet for which permission will not be granted, in which case the matter must be resolved before an offer of accommodation is made by the GHA.

2. Pet ownership that does not need prior permission from GHA

- a. GHA allows tenants to keep a small number of pets, only 1 or 2, without needing GHA's permission i.e. rabbits, guinea pigs, and small caged birds e.g. Finches, Budgies or Canaries. Permission for multiple small pets is not automatically granted.
- b. Appendix 1 details breed of animals and number allowed to be kept without obtaining permission. It also identifies animals not permitted to be kept under <u>any</u> circumstances whatsoever. This list has been drawn up in partnership with the States Veterinary Officer. Tenants are permitted to have only one type of pet from any one category but not more than 2 in total. Should a tenant want more than two small pets they must seek prior written permission from the GHA.

3. Obtaining permission for other pets such as a cat or dog

a. Any tenant wanting to get a cat, dog or pet not listed on Appendix must complete a Pet Application Form requesting prior permission from GHA.

b. If deemed necessary GHA will seek advice from animal welfare agencies and/or the States Veterinary Officer. The final decision as to whether permission will be granted or not will be made by the GHA as landlord of the property.

4. Permission will be granted if the:

- a. Animal is suited to the size of the property. Permission will not be granted for a dog unless there is an outside area i.e. garden/balcony/patio. House cats are permitted in flats, providing they are kept within the property, and not allowed to roam in any communal area.
- b. States Veterinary Officer or its representative agrees in writing to the GHA that the property is suitable for the animal
- c. Space needed to keep the pet does not detract from the primary use of the property.
- d. Breed of dog is on the GHA list of acceptable dogs Appendix 2.
- e. Animal is kept on a leash when in communal areas.
- f. Animal is not a farm animal for example chicken or pigs.
- g. Owner has obtained the necessary licence and/or permission from the States Veterinary Officer if required.
- h. Potential owner has not been found guilty or suspected of causing cruelty and/or any form of neglect to an animal previously.
- i. Tenant is able to care for the pet e.g. through times of poor mobility or health issues the tenant is unable to care for the pet in any way, the tenant must make suitable arrangements for the pet to be cared for temporarily or permanently.
- j. Tenant does not owe GHA money, has not fallen into any rent arrears during the last3 months and has maintained a good history of rent payment.
- k. Animal will receive regular suitable treatment to prevent risk of infestation on the animal and property from fleas and any other insects or suchlike.
- I. Animal does not pose any risk or danger to other residents within the same household or not.
- m. Animal does not cause any nuisance by excessive noise such as barking, whining, howling or squealing).
- n. Animal is not allowed to roam unattended and is kept under control (excluding cats).
- o. Animal does not foul in neighbouring gardens or in any communal areas owned by GHA.
- p. Owner immediately fully clears up any animal excrement after their animal, bags up and correctly disposed of in a designated bin or takes home to dispose of.
- q. Keeping of the animal does not cause unpleasant odours in the household or for neighbouring properties.
- r. Animal has been micro chipped.
- s. Animal is neutered or will be by a qualified Vet as it reaches an appropriate age.
- t. Animal is not kept or bred for any commercial purposes whatsoever.
- u. Tenant does not already have 2 dogs or 2 cats or a cat and a dog.

5. Should these conditions not be kept to:

- a. GHA will withdraw consent for any pet(s) should:
 - Any of the above conditions be breached or
 - Where the keeping of such pets results in a breach of the tenancy or licence agreement
- b. Should the tenant breach these conditions GHA will commence legal action to repossess the property.

Appendix 1

The tables below show categories of animals that tenants/license holders may look to keep and the maximum number of pets and cages that are allowed. Prior written permission from GHA must be obtained in advance to keep multiple pets.

All pets in any category below that are high-lighted in green <u>do not</u> need permission providing the tenant/license holder complies with the maximum number that are allowed and where required the animal is neutered.

Only 1 option from any section is permitted without requesting GHA permission.
